Free Midtown Manhattan Walking Tour

Tour begins from the **northeast corner** of 42nd and Broadway ([map](#))

Tour ends at 30 Rockefeller Plaza ([map](#))

Tour lasts approximately 2 hours

Total Distance is approximately 1 mile (1.6 kilometer)

Q: Can you give me directions to the tour and back from the tour?

A: We have provided Google maps for both the tour starting and ending points. Google maps allows you to input your starting or ending address (hotel, house, etc) and will give up updated and accurate walking, driving and most importantly mass transit directions.
